

## Editorial statute of the journal *Anatomy of Crime*

### 1

*Anatomy of Crime* is owned by the Institute of Criminal Law and Criminal Sciences of the University of Lisbon School of Law, domiciled at Faculdade de Direito da Universidade de Lisboa, Alameda da Universidade, 1649-014 Lisbon - Portugal and begin its publication in 2014.

### 2

(Independence)

*Anatomy of Crime* is independent of political power, economic power and private interest groups and identifies with the values of the social and democratic rule of law.

### 3

(Scientific area)

1. The journal, including in its special issues, publishes studies in the field of criminal law, or other areas of law, knowledge and science related to human behaviour, when considered relevant contributions to scientific debate or knowledge about crime and its agents.
2. The journal privileges the publication of studies and unpublished researches and has no orientation regarding disciplines, school, or method.

### 4

(Objectives)

The Journal aims to contribute to the creation and transmission of knowledge in different areas of Criminal Law, in dialogue with other areas of legal, scientific, and artistic thinking, seeks to publicize the research activity of Criminal Law investigators and other areas of knowledge and science and encourages the publication of results of academic and scientific work.

The Journal maintains a high standard of quality, as well as the regularity and punctuality of the publication.

### 5

(Themes and sections)

1. The Journal integrates sections dedicated to the discussion of current scientific topics (thematic sections): editorial with topical themes, diverse articles, literature reviews, annotated jurisprudence, and student work.
2. The Journal may create new sections, either permanently or occasionally.
3. The Journal may also publish thematic volumes.

(Editorial organization)

1. The Journal is directed by the director, the deputy directors and / or subdirectors and by the Editorial Board. The director is, by inherent form, the President of the IDPCC, and is responsible for the content of the entire journal, including all special issues, is in charge of organizing the different phases of the publication of the journal, as Editor-in-Chief: publication of the period of reception of articles; organization of collaborations in the different sections of the journal; requesting budgets; up-to-date maintenance and extension of swaps; other necessary administrative acts.
2. The Editorial Board shall be composed of all members of the IDPCC, who shall advise the director; define the scientific guidelines of the journal; define quality standards; decide on the publication of thematic issues and verify and approve the credentials of guest editors, supervising their work as well; determine refereeing rules; approve the editorial rules of the texts; approve the graphic model; approve or amend the Editorial Statute of the journal; pronounce on matters submitted to it by the Director; indicate the members of the Editorial Board.
3. The Editorial Board shall meet at least once a year, by convocation of the director.
4. The deputy directors assist the director in their duties, ensuring their replacement in the impediments, according to the rules of academic precedence.

(Readers)

The journal is published for all interested readers, national and foreign, and is governed by standards of rigor, clarity, and scientific basis in the texts that it publishes.

(Offers and exchanges)

1. Authors who collaborate with *Anatomia do Crime* shall be entitled to five copies.
2. Members of the Board of Directors and of the Editorial Board are entitled to a copy.
3. The journal maintains exchange with similar magazines, national or foreign. Publications received in exchange are deposited in the Central Library of the University of Lisbon School of Law.
